

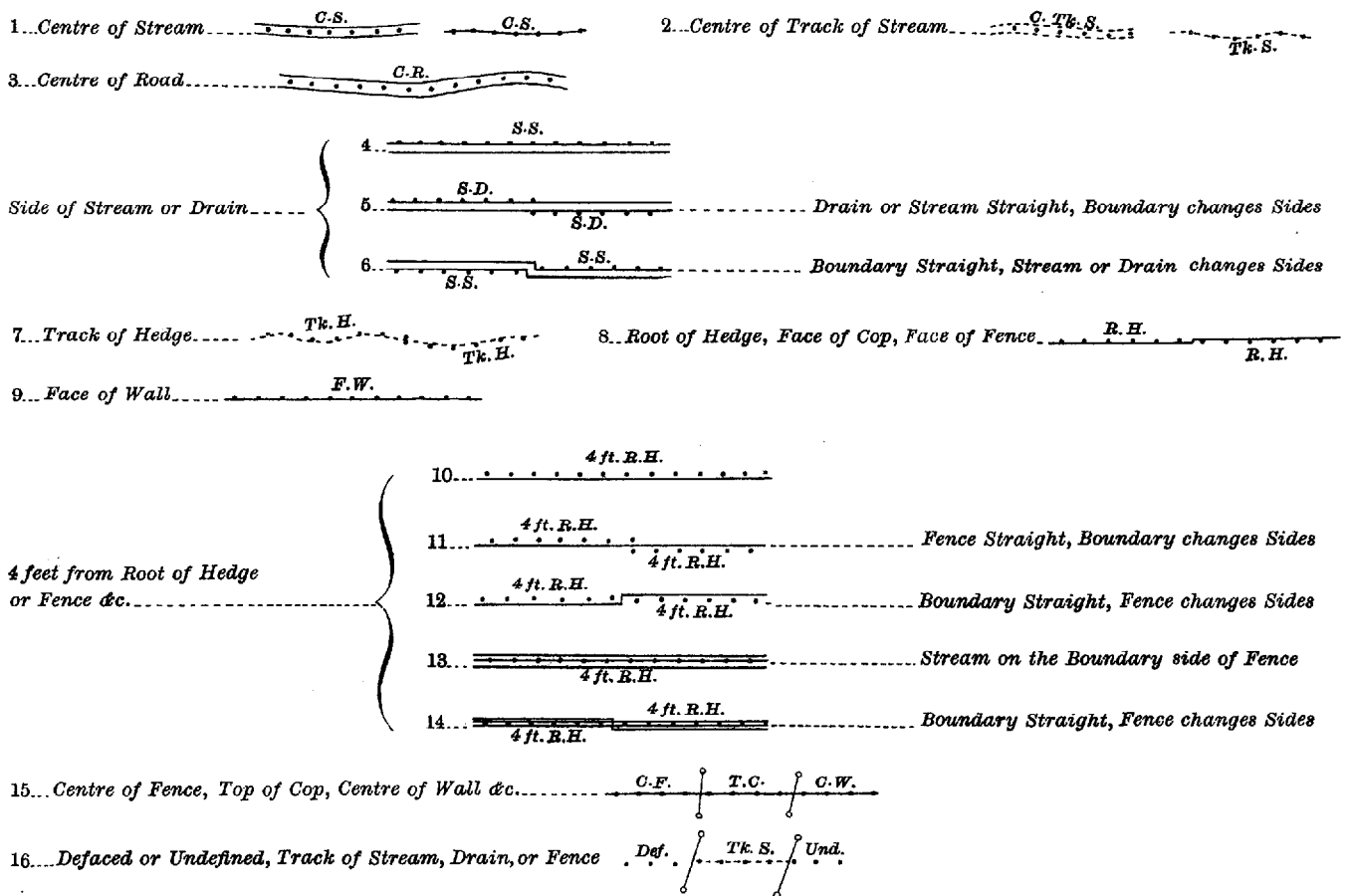

### Method of shewing the Boundaries in connection with the Detail.

The initials are placed where a change occurs in the nature of the Boundaries, as referred to a road, wall, stream, drain, or fence, and the symbol..... is used for marking the extent of the Boundary to which the initials refer.



From 4 to 9 the dots should be in contact with the line which represents the Side of Stream or Drain, Root of Hedge, Face of Cop, Face of Fence, Face of Wall.

From 10 to 14 the dots should not be in contact with the line which represents the Hedge or Fence, &c.

No. 15 The dots should be on the continuous line representing Centre of Fence, Top of Cop, Centre of Wall, &c.
